
What is community-led housing?

 Community-led housing is about local people playing a leading and lasting role in solving local housing problems, creating genuinely affordable homes and strong communities in ways that are difficult to achieve through mainstream housing.

- Buckland Newton first CLT in West Dorset formed in 2006
- Completed a scheme of 10 units in 2011
- Learnt a lot of lessons but a really good example of what could be achieved

- Four schemes completed 2014 2016
- Marshwood 8 homes
- Toller Porcorum 6 homes
- Maiden Newton 14 homes
- Symondsbury 10 homes

- Lyme Regis 15 homes just completed
- Powerstock
- Dorchester
- Bishops Caundle
- Broadwindsor
- Will mean over 100 community owned homes in West Dorset

- All schemes support by Wessex
- All working partnership with an RP
- Had capital grant from HCA
- Set up costs paid by WDDC
- Completed schemes all rural exception sites

Lessons from recently completed schemes

- Sites chosen may not be the easiest to develop
- Schemes often complex
- Can be expensive
- Need to spend time on community engagement
- Ensure good housing needs data

How does WDDC support CLTs

- Financial support for set up fees
- Capital grant for some schemes
- Help with housing needs work
- Supported schemes through planning
- Helped to overcome problems
- Informal support

- New homes bonus


Why does WDDC support CLTs housing?

Why does WDDC support CLTs



Community Led Housing Fund

- £60 million annual fund
- First year allocated directly to Local Authorities
- Fund may be used as
 - capital investment, technical support and revenue
 - to make more schemes viable and
 - significantly increase community groups' current delivery pipelines.
