




# Preparing for a storm – testing your emergency plan

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#### Why do we need emergency plans?



- Identifying risk and hazards
- Identifying triggers and actions
- Assigning responsibility
- Reduce the risk to others










Risk = Hazard x Exposure x Vulnerability







#### **Vulnerable People**



- Elderly
- Long-term sick and disabled
- Financially deprived
- Single parents and children
- Language and ethnicity
- Transient and recent immigrants
- Tourists
- Homeless
- Students

What makes each group more or uniquely at risk?





#### **Types of Triggers**



- UK Government Alert
- Met Office Severe Weather Warning
- EA Flood Alert and Flood Warning
- Media (TV, Radio, socials)
- Impacts observed on site / nearby indicator locations
- Site specific triggers
- Reports from
  - Emergency Services
  - Environment Agency
  - City Council (Highways Authority, Lead Local Flood Authority, Resilience Team)
  - Water and Sewerage Companies
  - o Electricity/gas companies





#### Response Structure



#### Phase 1

Be aware and prepare

Phase 1 trigger activated: make preparations and be on standby for a possible impacts.

#### Phase 2

Act, adapt and remain vigilant

Phase 2 trigger activated: take steps to ensure your safety and the safety of those you are responsible for.

#### Phase 3

Survive and contain/evacuate

Phase 3 trigger activated: take actions to survive.

Amber Warning for wind



Yellow warning for rain



100-150mm forecast for higher ground



40-70mm forecast for lower ground, 30mm of this could fall in 2hrs



Coinciding with high spring tides



Wet winter

- Who is going to lead your response?
- What do you need to put in place now?
- How are you going to communicate the risk and to whom?



#### Phase 3



- What are your risks?
- What are you going to do now?
- How do you ensure your own safety?
- How are you going to communicate?
- What response are you no longer going to be able to provide?

 What can you do now to think about how you would support the community whilst they recover?





#### **Debrief**



- What worked well in your plan?
- What didn't work well in your plan?
- What are the opportunities to improve your plan?
