





#### What this map shows

This is a map of Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2019 data for NHS Devon CCG. The colours on the map indicate the deprivation decile of each Lower Layer Super Output Area (LSOA) for England as a whole, and the coloured bars above indicate the proportion of LSOAs in each national deprivation decile. The most deprived areas (decile 1) are shown in blue. It is important to keep in mind that the data relate to small areas and do not tell us how deprived, or wealthy, individual people are. LSOAs have an average population of just under 1,700 (as of 2017).

- Peninsula Dental
  - 236 appointments offered, 70% attended
- Substance Use Steering Group
